Presentation by Elliott Golden (photography)

Elliott has been doing automotive photography for about 8 years, including vintage cars. For the past few years, he has been doing consignments and photography of cars for sale. This includes learning the story of the cars and writing them up. He shared photos of a '51 Chevy that he recently sold. He talked about how to use photos to improve marketing to improve value of the car.

Some pointers: Presentation is Everything. Pull the car out, set it up next to nice old gas station, etc. for a nice period-applicable background. Think about the number of photos available for the listing – more photos help build trust with the buyer. He also recommends taking fun photos of your car and mixing photographing your car for leisure and for sale.

Taking phone photos is OK. You don't necessarily need all the gear to take a nice photo. He notes that the general difference between Iphone photos and professional camera photos is the clarity of zoom - But that good photos are not necessarily about the gear.

Basics of photography. Elliott shared with us the difference that can be made through some simple choices. He shared photos of a BMW 2002 in hot sunlight with sun in wheel wells, limited color clarity due to shade, evening the color out between photos. The ideal situation is to use some shade and to eliminate harsh shadows and get an even pallet of colors.

Using a wide angle lens vs. telephoto lens can also help. Shooting the car at eye level at wide angle gives us exactly what we see every day. Elliot recommends never taking photos like this because it is not unique. There is nothing eye catching about it. A telephoto lens provides a different perspective of the car and more even proportions. Standing back provides a more square look at the car.

Close up photos may provide a greater look at the quality and condition of the car. This can be good for selling.

For selling a car on Facebook Marketplace, the first photo should always be the front quarter shot. It should show the whole car in an even view. Sites use square cropping, so often, uploaded photos end up cropped and may not show what you want them to. Some sites may restrict the number of photos that you can post. Elliott suggests adding a dropbox link to the ad with additional photos to maximize the number of photos. "It speaks for itself." Your car is not the sole speaker; it's the presentation. The hook for a sale is the photos. The car speaks only after the people are drawn in. Photos show that you care(d) for your car.

Elliott shared some additional photos:

- AMC Matador, Mecum Auction. The photos will be on their website. The auction house markets the car before they get the car. They use the submitted photos. It is big bucks to get the auction house to take the photos.
- 1966 Olds Toronado (also went to Mecum). Think about the surroundings in the photo. Avoid distracting, negative backgrounds (poles, ratty fences, etc.) .

Photos are important in any online marketing. *Bring A Trailer* is one of the biggest sites as far as trusting people. Most cars are bought from this website sight unseen. Typically, there are 300-400 photos per car on the site. Potential buyers can see every angle of the car that's possible.

Elliott talked about some techniques he uses. A polarizer helps to undo the reflection in the windows and glass and improves the photos of the car. Editing software can also help take the photos to the next level.

Use Facebook special interest groups when marketing (ie. antique car pages, malaise autos, specialty car pages, etc.) to help hit a direct-interest market.

Photography, Elliott follows a rule of thirds. Centering the car creates a less interesting photo. He will offset slightly to the side and vertically to create more interest. Cars move, they aren't static in the middle. Elliott often shoots lower in the frame to get more sky. Elliott shared some additional examples and photos of interest.

- Nissan President was solely sold as an executive vehicle. Photos with an airport background make sense. Putting a car in context can add to the interest of the photos. Match the era of the car and evoke emotion.
- Model A club at Belmont. Cars were photographed with a pea-gravel road. Improve the context, create the scene.
- Motorsports photography. Peerless Gt on a racetrack.

Elliott's Hobby – finding interesting locations.

Go out and take photos of your car and enjoy!!

Elliott does have business cards available.

Thank you to Elliott for jumping right in and giving a club presentation!! Three more presentations are needed to wrap up the year. Terry will do September. August and October are needed. Anything you can tell the club about would be welcomed.

Liz offered fresh tomatoes in the back of the room.

Ben closed the meeting with a prayer.

Auburn Nationals

After the AACA Central Spring Nationals were cancelled in Auburn, Indiana in 2020 and after the Auburn Auctions Park (where the Central Nationals had been held) went up for sale in 2021 and was sold in 2022, it was nice to see that the AACA Central Spring Nationals were back on for Auburn this year, 2023, albeit at a different venue. No longer at the Auctions Park, the Meet was moved to Dekalb High School in Waterloo, Indiana, just a few miles north of Auburn. Despite the new venue, the events preceding the Meet and the Meet itself remained popular and well attended. One of the prime reasons for this is the historic Auburn-Cord-Duesenberg (ACD) Automobile Museum in Auburn (on the east side of Interstate 69) which contains the original Design, Engineering, Sales, and Executive offices of the large Cord Company run by E.L. Cord in the 1920s and 1930s. Preceding the Meet, many AACA members could be seen exploring the 3-story Museum and its modern gift shop as well as the adjacent relocated 1874 Eckhart Carriage Company building (precursor to the Auburn Automobile Company).

Another of the prime draws for the Auburn Meet is the National Automobile and Truck Museum (NATMUS) situated behind the ACD Museum, in a multi-story manufacturing plant that E.L. Cord oversaw. Inside the plant on the main floor are hundreds of restored antique vehicles as well as dozens of early gas station pumps, by brand, and a model cars section and gift shop. In the basement of the complex were secret design, manufacturing, and testing facilities that enabled the Cord Company to continue their engineering advancements without observation from its competitors. Today, this basement is open for touring, and is packed with even more early antique trucks and vehicles.

Yet another draw for the Auburn Meet is the Early Ford V-8 Foundation Museum, on the west side of I69 in Auburn. This modern museum is dedicated to preserving the 1932 to 1953 Early Ford V-8 history, and presents a sequential lay out of model years enabling visitors to take in the engineering and design advancements year-over-year, decade-over-decade. This museum also has a large dealership showroom which includes one of every 1936 Ford model produced. Throughout the dealership area and the rest of the museum, various cross-sectioned engines and transmissions are on display, providing keen insight to the overall designs and their internals, mechanizations, and forgings and castings. This museum also has a modest parts department mock-up and a small gift shop. Adjacent to the Early Ford V-8 museum is a new educational and training center for automotive students and enthusiasts.

The Central Spring Nationals Meet itself was well organized at the Dekalb High School, with efficient registration and typical Membership Roundtable Meeting and Judges Breakfast and Continuing Judges Education (CJE). The show field was impressive, with well over 100 high quality restored antique cars, trucks, and motorcycles, ranging from early Holley (1903), Sandusky Courier (1904), Sears (1910), REO (1910), Ford (1911 and 1915), Walker Electric (1919), Nash (1927), Rolls-Royce (1927), Pierce-Arrow (1929), Cadillac (1929), Chevrolet (1930), Chrysler (1930), Hudson (1934), SS 1 (1935), Auburn (1935), Divco (1936), Buick (1948), Chrysler (1948), Willys (1952), Packard (1955), Pontiac (1959), Austin-Healey (1960), Desoto (1960), and 1970s (AMC, Torino, and Triumph), 1980s (AMC, Buick, Cadillac, Mustangs, Oldsmobile, and Pontiac), and 1990s (Bronco, Chrysler, Mercedes-Benz, Mercury, and Pontiac) ... just to name a few of the 111 award winners.

While we saw only two other couples from Virginia at the meet (from Richmond and Jamestown), the small towns of Auburn and Waterloo and the historic antique automotive museums and the

AACA Central Spring National Meet itself are well worth the 600 miles of travel one-way ... and recommended.
