#### **Authorships during Restoration - for Outyear Preservation**

## How a Warning Shot drove 7 Books and Papers By Neil, the Magneto's Mystery Author and Contributor

#### Article 23

Throughout the multi-year restoration of the 1999 Hyundai Elantra that I have been undertaking, I have taken on an extra level of effort focused on learning and documenting the car's entire electronics. This has involved dissecting and reverse-engineering all of the car's computers and mapping all the computers' interfaces. The effort also has included the electrical measurements and analyses of all the car's sensors and actuators. During the journey, the electronics work, results, and findings have been documented in a series of books and papers, generally one book per computer system - but also a computer-diagnostics and self-diagnostics book encompassing all the computers together. (This multi-computer book was the first book authored and spans all Hyundai Elantras from their first introduction in the U.S. in 1991 through 2000 – Elantra generations 1 and 2. Each year is covered - 1991, 1992, 1993, 1994, 1995, 1996, 1997, 1998, 1999, and 2000, per computer system.)

So, why did I tackle an effort of this magnitude? Well, several reasons. One was curiosity. I wanted to know how everything worked. But, another reason was to ensure the long-term outyear preservation of the Elantra, by documenting and thereby providing for others the contemporaneous restoration and engineering/electronics baselined-findings that do not exist elsewhere. And, this reason can be explained and understood best by what I was observing as the restoration years were proceeding.

I was noticing a rapid diminishment in the number of early Hyundais on the roads. So, I looked into this and did some legwork. In checking with the Hyundai dealership, I learned that no customers come into the dealership anymore for any Hyundai repairs or parts for Hyundais from the 1980s (Hyundai's first introductions in the U.S. were the Excels in 1985 and the Sonatas in 1989 - with the Excels having had so many electrical issues that new sales back then had dropped to 1 per month at the dealership) ... and no customers come in anymore for repairs or parts for Hyundais from the 1990s for any 1st generation Scoupes, 1st generation Accents, 1st generation Elantras, 1st generation Tiburons, and 2nd generation Sonatas - and only 1 customer comes in for any 2<sup>nd</sup> generation Elantra parts. Also, in checking with a high-volume car repair shop – with a long history in the area, the data in their system agreed with the dealer's information, showing that the repair shop had had no Hyundais from the 1980s nor 1990s having been brought in for repairs since the early aughts! Further, in checking with the regional automotive junkyards, they no longer have any Hyundais from the 1980s nor 1990s. Zero. Further still, in checking the active on-line Hyundai forums, there are only a couple of posts (over the past couple of years) from owners with Hyundais from the 1980s and 1990s - with most of those posts being from overseas and none being the original owners. And, in checking the availability of factory parts for the early Hyundais, the stocks are largely depleted and unavailable and discontinued - with no back-ordered parts possible, being out of production.

Thus, my anecdotal observations were an important *warning shot*. The number of remaining early Hyundais had been declining even more than I had realized and continues to significantly dwindle. The supply of remaining early factory Hyundai parts has been declining at an alarming rate and continues to significantly dwindle, with much of the originally U.S.-warehoused parts now largely depleted ... and with much of the originally Korean-warehoused parts also now largely depleted – which is further complicated by the long-distance logistics and time-zone issues involved in trying to obtain those parts ... and with no factory- nor supplier-re-manufacturing of the depleted stocks


occurring ... and with little availability in the way of aftermarket Hyundai parts (and with those not being desirable anyway). The warning shot *alerted* that time is of the essence for saving the early Hyundais *and* that Asian cars and cars with advanced electronics pose their own unique restoration and preservation undertakings - with significant challenges.

And so, if I wanted to finish the restoration and provide for the car's long-term preservation while concomitantly achieving AACA's goals of authenticity and originality, I had to likewise invest the time and energy to fully understand the outyear electronics, computer, and electrical issues that will ensue. And, at that point, it made sense to author the books and papers and pre-purchase the factory parts remaining available - including the computers, as these books and parts will be vital for the car's distant survival.
