MONTHLY MEETING 18 APRIL 2023

Meeting was held at the Dorothy Hart Community Center. There were 23 members, including Angie Govoni (daughter or Robert and Silvia Govoni) in attendance.

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 PM.

The **March minutes** were approved as in the Magneto.

Treasurer Report – Mark presented the treasurer's report.

The meeting room is now renewed in a 3-month cycle. Mark contacts the POC and reserves the 3rd month out every month.

The financial report from ODMA was not yet finalized. There will be a report at a later date.

Presentation: Angie Govoni gave a presentation about "Disaster Preparedness: Building a Safer, Smarter Stafford County". Angie is a high school senior at the Commonwealth Governor's School. She recently received her Girl Scout's Gold Award (equivalent to an Eagle Scout Award). Angie is going to be attending UVA in the fall. The presentation was based on a 26 page research paper she wrote as part of her school and Girl Scout projects.

Angie talked about types of disasters; importance of preparedness; how to prepare; advantages of early preparation; how to prepare for your family; and where to find outreach and support. She used the acronym READI for Recognizing types of disasters; Evaluation of the importance of preparation; Actively preparing; Determining what to prepare; and Implementing your plan.

For all types of disasters, (e.g. house fire, hurricanes, tornadoes, winter storms, earthquakes, and forest fires), it is best to prepare before disaster happens. This will result in you being better equipped to deal with the disaster, making it easier to manage, instilling confidence, and leading to better recovery overall.

Some misconceptions about planning include: You don't need to buy a lot all at once; you should consolidate what you already have. Knowledge is free. Disasters can happen anywhere, including close to home. Stay vigilant and know about your community support system, including county officials.

Preparation (before) includes: rotation of supplies to keep items fresh, paying attention to news reports and alerts, understanding potential effects, establishing connections within the community, building a preparedness kit, and regularly checking safety equipment like smoke detectors and fire extinguishers. During the event, it is important to conserve resources, be vigilant for updates, and stay calm and stick to your plan. After the event, it is important to reassess and update the plan as needed, observe and respect scarcity of resources, restock your supplies that were used, and learn from any mistakes.

Preparedness includes an emergency kit. This should be personalized for your family's needs, suited to various disasters, and as simple or elaborate as your family needs. Families should encourage plan creation and review this biannually. Think about children, elderly, and pets and plan accordingly.

Local resources include VirginiaReady.com and Stafford County Emergency Management Facebook page.

Encourage Others and Encourage Preparedness

Following the presentation, the meeting continued.

HFRAACA Meet Update:

J. showed the members the meet plaques, in the shape of a Rt 66 Shield. Flyers are available.

Gettysburg, Caneway Center in historic Gettysburg, PA. This venue will accommodate the awards banquet as well as a number of social events we have planned. It also will accommodate the show field, thea market, car corral, trailer parking, and spectator parking. Host Hotel Headquarters

The Wyndham Gettysburg gives you the chance to live in comfort while you tour to some of the nation's most important historic sites. This 248-room full-service hotel on six floors is located on a site with a 2nd hotel with over 1,000 combined parking spaces. There are large and attractive public rooms and there is a giant-screen movie theater onsite. Rooms have flat screen TVs with seating areas, and plenty of space to lounge. There are three restaurants onsite with two serving traditional American cuisine. The lobby bar is the place to be and the large indoor heated Olympic-size pool, hot tub and fitness center are just what the doctor ordered after a busy day. Public transit stops in front of the hotel on the half hour daily.

Located east of Gettysburg, just off Routes 15 and 30, the Wyndham is 10 minutes from Gettysburg National Military Park and the Gettysburg Battlefield Museum. Downtown Gettysburg is three miles away. Harrisburg International Airport is 45 miles from the hotel and Hagerstown Regional Airport is 41 miles away. With 61,000 square feet of event space, it is the largest meeting venue in the area.

Trailer parking will be available onsite at \$30.00 regardless of stay. Gettysburg Region workers will be available beginning on Wednesday, May 17th to assist with parking. Absolutely no motorhomes or combination units will be permitted on the hotel property or trailer parking area. If you arrive after posted hours please park along one of the many roads in the Gateway Complex, so that we can park you in an orderly fashion during posted hours.

Show Day

The Saturday car show will be held onsite. Registration will be from 7:00 a.m. till 11:00 a.m. at the show field. Judging of show cars will begin promptly at 11:00 am. All vehicles must remain on the show field till 3:00 p.m.

Flea Market and Car Corral

You are encouraged to visit the flea market and car corral that is located onsite. The outdoor spaces are located in front of the Wyndham on the grass. The flea market and car corral will be operating 8 a.m. until 5 p.m. daily beginning Wednesday, May 17th. The Car Corral is limited to 1998 and earlier non-modified vehicles. Space size is 12'x 25'. All Flea Market and Car Corral spaces are \$35.00 per space. Indoor space for Corral spaces are \$35.00 per space. Indoor per space (12'x 10'). No unclean or large parts please. Bring your own tables and chairs. The indoor spaces are located at the rear of the Wyndham banquet foyer area.


